

Act on Immunities and Privileges of International  
Organizations,  
No. 98/1992

Article 1

In Iceland, international organizations shall enjoy the immunities and privileges enshrined in international agreements that have constitutional validity as regards Iceland.

In Iceland, the following shall also enjoy the immunities and privileges granted in these agreements:

1. staff members of international organizations,
2. those who represent or work for international organizations,
3. representatives, diplomats and envoys of parties to international organizations,
4. those who participate in litigation before international organizations, and
5. family members of those mentioned in subparagraphs 1 to 4.

Article 2

The Minister 1) lays down further rules regarding the implementation of this Act.

Article 3

This Act shall enter into force forthwith. 2)

1) The word „Minister“ in the Act refers solely to the Minister for Foreign Affairs.

2) The Act entered into force on 11 December 1992.
